








Oneida County experienced a slow and steady growth over the last 5 years. In 2021, Oneida County experienced a 1.92% growth from the previous year.

In 2016, 55 people moved to Oneida County. Since 2016, Oneida County has seen a steady decline in new residents.






AGE DISTRIBUTION

In 2021, Oneida County has experienced growth in all age ranges across the board. The median age has only increased 3.7 years since 2018. Oneida County has a strong core of a young to a middle-aged population that provides a well-rounded workforce

In Oneida County, 54.3% of the residents are under the age of 45, meaning long term labor output of the should be growing throughout the next two decades.

The working age population, defined as those 18-64, accounted for 53% of Oneida's 2021 population. The population over 65 years of age is 5.67% more than it was in 2018.

Educational Attainment



EDUCATION

In 2021, 27% of residents over 25 have a college degree in Oneida County. This is a 5% increase compared to 2017.

In 2021, Oneida County saw 28 less people with bachelor degrees and another 58 less with graduate degrees in 2021.

Those with graduate degrees have increased by 61% since 2017, an increase from approximately 100 residents to 161 residents.




HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATES

The high school graduation rate was calculated with the weighted averages of the graduation rates for all districts within Oneida County.


The significance of these data points is it reflects the ability to train workers in new skills or jobs. Highly educated populations are easily trained to be productive parts of the modern workforce.

JOB GROWTH

Oneida County saw a decline of growth during the pandemic in 2020 but has since rebounded strongly averaging a 9.87% growth annually in the following years since the pandemic. This is well above the national average and the state.

Increasing job growth allows there to be more openings for new residents and those entering the workforce from high school and college. It also shows expanding growth in local companies in the region.

KEY INDUSTRIES



EMPLOYMENT BY SECTOR

Each sector is represented by its share of total employment for each given year. Transportation, and Other Services did see notable declines in 2021 from the previous year.

Some notable increases were in Manufacturing, Finance/Retail Estate, and Arts/Recreation from the previous year.

The Health Care/Education sector is still the largest sector employing 34% of Oneida County's population


LOCATION QUOTIENT

Location quotient represents the share of an industries need for employees in an area compared to its national average. For example, Oneida County's Natural Resource and Mining industry has a location quotient of 12.1 meaning it employs 12 times the national average within the industry.


In contrast, the location quotient for the Education and Health Services industry has fallen to .1 meaning Oneida County's share of employment in the industry is half of the national average.

Per Capita Personal Income




INCOME PER CAPITA

In 2019, the per capita income of Oneida County was \$38,402. It rose by over \$6,000 dollars since then and was \$44,887 in 2021.

Oneida County experienced an increase due to a shortening labor market making competition to pay employees more to compete with others in the open market.

Median Household Income




MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME

The median household income has increased the last 5 years. In 2021, Oneida County experienced a large increase compared to previous years.

Oneida County saw a 18.87% increase in household income from 2020 to 2021 to a new median of \$64,766.

Unemployment spiked in the nation in early 2020. Oneida County saw a peak of 6.9%.

After the spike, Oneida County experienced a return to pre-pandemic levels and now unemployment is at 2.5%.

COST OF LIVING

Cost of living is increasing in Oneida County. In 2021, the cost of living was 94.3 meaning when the average American spends \$100 on normal goods those in Oneida County only spent \$94.30.

One of the main drivers for the low cost of living is the abundance of wind and hydroelectric generation helping to bring down utility costs.






